Art Femenella, Recipient of the 2022 AGG Joseph Barnes Award

Established in 2008, the AGG Board of Directors set the wheels in motion to create an award for an outstanding member of the stained glass community. The AGG wanted this award to reflect our goals and our mission and to acknowledge a person for service to the profession of stained glass. Thus, the Joseph Barnes Award was instituted. The guidelines for the Joseph Barnes Lifetime Achievement Award are based on its namesake's love of working with glass, his friendliness toward others, and his desire to help others succeed.

During the June 2022 Conference in Corning, New York, the American Glass Guild had planned to present the Joseph Barnes Award to Arthur J. Femenella, Sr., to recognize the passion, dedication, and mentoring that he has provided to the glass community at large. More important than his exemplary resume and curriculum vitae, this award focused on his good nature, generosity, and willingness to help others. However, Arthur became ill, could not be at the conference, and passed away during the midst of the event. With sad hearts, the award was given posthumously.

"Art was a gifted teacher and incredibly generous with his time and knowledge, continuously encouraging me to strive for excellence in stained glass conservation. I will be forever grateful for the positive input and effect he had on my career as a stained glass conservator, and I am honored to have called him a friend," said Roberto Rosa.

"I started as an apprentice at The Art of Glass, Inc., in 1998, and the studio frequently collaborated with Art Femenella on restoration and conservation projects. It was always clear that Art valued all the members of a studio team and their individual contributions at every level of experience. His patience and humor combined with an encyclopedic level of knowledge provided an invaluable resource for the over two decades that I worked with him. I have gotten to know many other stained glass colleagues through him, thanks to his contributions as a founding member of the American Glass Guild," said Amy Valuck.
