As part of our ambition to support emerging graduates at the beginning of what they hope will be a long career in glassmaking, CGS offers an annual Graduate Prize and produces the *New Graduate Review*, featuring the work of some of the best of the UK's glass art graduates emerging from British and Irish universities and colleges. Congratulations to the Winners

The judges had a long and arduous task in selecting the four Graduate Prize Winners, five Highly Commended Graduates, and ten Commended Graduates to be included in the *New Graduate Review 2023*. Many of this year's graduates had to navigate through COVID and all the barriers that followed. We are delighted to give four Prizes and produce the *New Graduate Review 2023* that will offer a window to their work and help them on their glass journey. All British and Irish students graduating from an accredited course in 2023 were eligible to enter.

The First Prize includes £500 in cash, £200 Creative Glass UK vouchers, the cover and two feature pages in the *New Graduate Review 2023*, and a two-year CGS membership. Alan J. Poole will provide a selection of glass related books, including *A Passion For Glass*, and a free subscription to *Neues Glas – New Glass: Art & Architecture* magazine.

The Second Prize includes £150 in cash, a £100 voucher from Warm Glass, a year's subscription to *Neues Glas – New Glass: Art & Architecture* magazine, and a one-year CGS membership. The two runners-up will each receive a £50 voucher from Pearsons Glass, a one-year CGS membership, and a free subscription to *Neues Glas – New Glass: Art & Architecture* magazine.
