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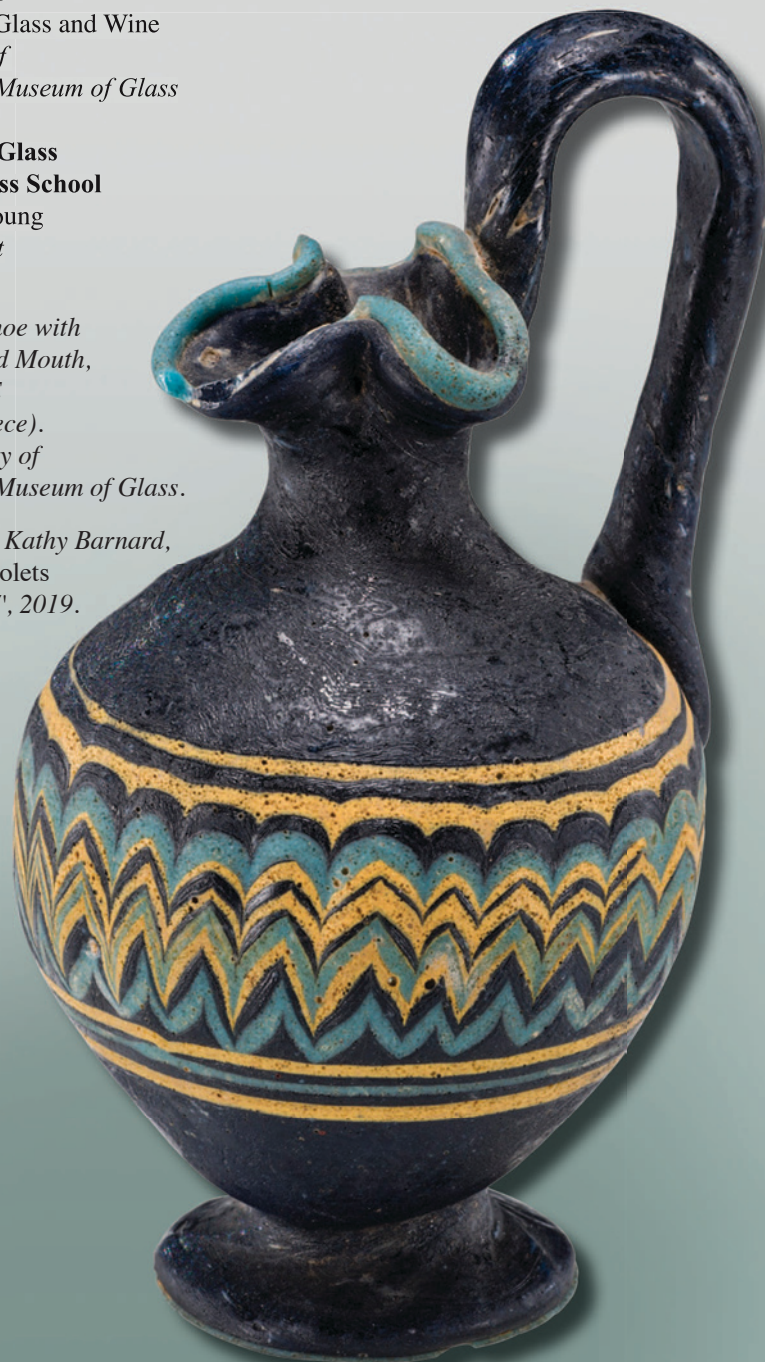

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William Gudenrath

Renowned Glassblower, Scholar, and Teacher

I always find it interesting when a person hones in on a point in history to study, emulate, and explore. Something about that era, that point in time, resonates with them and often gives clues to personality and motivation. For William Gudenrath, Resident Advisor of The Studio, the educational wing of The Corning Museum of Glass (CMoG) in Corning, New York, it is the Renaissance to Baroque period of European artistic history that calls to him.

The Call of Chemistry, History, and Music

At the tender age of 11 until he was 15, Gudenrath began to explore what would become his foundation of scientific glassblowing with a youth chemistry set. During that time, a late-night radio program of Bach's organ music in his hometown of Houston, Texas, set him on his life's path—that, and a great appreciation for *The Yellow Pages* phone directory. It was a big book, published yearly by the telephone company, with listings of companies offering a wide variety of goods and services, cross-referenced and printed on bright yellow paper. In some communities, the books were so big they functioned as a doorstop or even a booster seat for toddlers needing a little extra height to reach the table.

After exhausting all the glass tubing in his chemistry set in a weeks' time, Bill set out to find more. After consulting the big yellow book—Google before there was Google, as he calls it—he found The Scientific Glassblowing Company at 5510 Lawndale Street in Houston, conveniently located near his grandmother's house. Luckily, the owner Robert Muller let him come in on Saturday mornings and practice. By the time he was 16 years old, his work was “pretty decent” by his own recollection, aided by a driving need to practice.

Gudenrath recalls rushing home from school to blow glass the way some kids would rush home to do homework or play outside. But then, there was also that radio show that played Bach's organ music. What was it that was so intriguing, and what exactly did they have in common beyond the timing? During the 225-year period between 1500 AD and 1725 AD, Europe experienced a great period of artistic growth. The Age of Enlightenment saw great strides in process, scientific thought, and reason. Gudenrath sees that period as a Golden Age.

“The difficulty of process is intriguing. Bach was a supermaster of harmonic language, being able to write in both a horizontal and vertical way, creating a harmony and counterpoint never seen before.” He also cites the advances of the Venetian glass trade during that period. “Venetians took the standard practice of glassmaking and pushed it beyond anything the world has seen. However, the Venetian government had such specific laws governing the industry that no one master stands out by name, as you would see in other genres such as painting. These laws did not allow masters to emerge and gain recognition by name until the mid nineteenth century.”

The Venetian glass industry, however, became luxury glass suppliers to the rich and famous, creating gilded and enameled glassware for wealthy patrons all over Europe. Despite the government’s tight control over the process and practice, as other counties created their own glass traditions the Venetian industry withered, only to see it both ebb and flow in centuries to come. It is these two artistic traditions that drove Gudenrath to his career.

Discovering the Lure of the Furnace

But then, there was still that radio program. Gudenrath’s educational path led him to embrace music as he earned his bachelor’s degree in organ performance from North Texas State University, then a Master of Music degree in harpsicord from The Julliard School. He played his New York debut at Carnegie Recital Hall in 1975. He worked in music in much the same way many musicians do by taking jobs that allow a living but not much else. After a conversation with his brother, he decided to look back into glass.

In New York at that time, or anywhere in the United States, the Studio Glass Movement was in its infancy but it was growing, especially in New York, at a place called Clayworks/Glassworks in Soho. In 1981, it became New York Experimental Glass and in 1991 was reincarnated as Urban Glass. It was here that Gudenrath became exposed to furnace work.

Bill took classes, gained skill, and decided to leave lampworking behind, except to teach. From 1979 to 1981, he taught both neon and flameworking, all the while practicing at the furnace. This is also where he got to see Dick Marquis work. Dick had studied at the Venini factory in Murano, Italy. Gudenrath felt that he also could benefit from directly studying the Venetians. From 1981 through 1984, espionage trips to Murano became fact-finding missions. Because of the culture of secrecy in Murano, Bill learned how to ask questions in a nonthreatening way and even learned to say “Many people have told me of your marvelous work” skillfully in Italian in an effort to open doors. Another important phrase was, “Is that really glass?” He says that it put them at ease.

It was on one of these trips that he was finally able to locate a long admired master Carlo Tosi, aka Caramella, which means “little candy” in Italian. He used his best Italian phrases, and amazingly Tosi allowed him to sit behind him while he worked for three or four days. Armed with this new knowledge, Bill returned to New York and practiced for 8 or 9 months before going back to Italy.

Upon his return to the factory, Tosi pointed to Bill's backpack, knowing full well that he would have practiced back in America. Caramella, after having looked at Bill's work, left the room. Then a man in a suit appeared. He told Gudenrath that he owned the factory and firmly asked him to leave. The showroom was no longer open. It's a high compliment in a way, albeit a painful way to receive it. Gudenrath says he never saw Tosi again. Other masters of the craft came his way including Gianni Toso, who lived in New York in the winter of 1983 and set up shop at the school. Toso was generous with his tips and tricks and helped influence Gudenrath's practice.

Establishing The Studio at The Corning Museum of Glass

Gudenrath's days at Urban Glass provided an introduction to his future wife, Amy Schwartz. Amy was a student of glass when Urban Glass was located in Little Italy, New York, one of its many homes over the years. Her interest was one of recreation more than career. Her background was in computer systems, and she worked on Wall Street. Nonetheless a partnership was formed, and she and Gudenrath started a family.

In 1995, David Whitehouse, the director of The Corning Museum of Glass, approached Bill and Amy to do a feasibility study with the goal of building an educational wing for the museum. Prior to that, no hands-on or class opportunity existed there. Bill recalled going to Corning at the age of 14. They had routed the tour through the Steuben factory located next to the glass museum. You could watch glassblowers in a factory setting, but that was it. This new concept was luckily accepted by the CMOG board of directors, and at Whitehouse's urging, Amy and Bill started The Studio.

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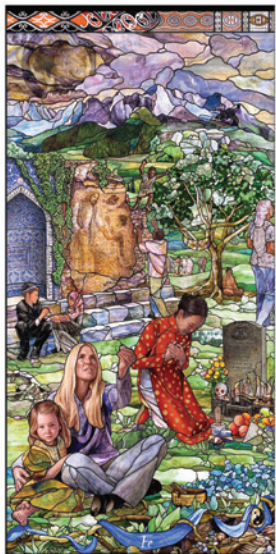
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Teaching and running the school also allows Gudenrath to create his own work at the furnace. Being heavily influenced by Venetian technique but also adapting his own techniques for working solo is a cornerstone of his practice. He cites a no-show assistant during his time at Urban Glass in 1981 for showing him how to adapt to working without an assistant. "It is possible to work solo," he says. Using a blow hose and a shorter blowpipe, his is able to complete tasks that previously were considered impossible.

Being enamored with the Venetian techniques, Gudenrath has dedicated his work to documenting and practicing. He has two e-books, *The Techniques of Renaissance Venetian Glassworking* and *The Techniques of Venetian-Style Glassworking* that are available free to any curious information seeker.

Speaking of Corning, Gudenrath praises Corning Incorporated as being excellent stewards of the town, creating a wonderful place to live and thrive. "It's a Fortune 100 company intent on creating a good place to live. Of course, they want to provide an environment where employees would want to live and work, so consequently, everyone benefits." **G&A**

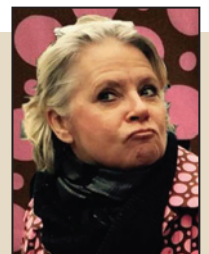



CHIMERAS AND CANNIBALISM

The mythological Chimera was a fire-breathing female monster with a lion's head, a goat's body, and a serpent's tail—in other words, things that do not typically go together. In modern science, a chimera is a creation that incorporates elements from entities that are usually unrelated in nature and possess different sets of originating genetic material.

We all know about cannibalism. In this case, I'm referring to the time-honored practice of stealing parts from one thing and using them to make another. "I cannibalized the carburetor from that one to get this thing running." Like that. It works in art, too, like the whole thing of looking around the work area, seeing something lying there, and saying to yourself, "Yeah, that might work." You stick it on and see what happens, and you've got a chimera.

Examples of Chimerism

A recent example of that would be when I was building some shot glasses a couple of weeks ago and had one blank left over. It was little, about the size of a communion cup, but it had elegant lines and I didn't want to trash it. I hate to do that.

I happened to be banging out a few pairs of calla lily earrings for my wife to bring our inventory up to snuff in preparation for opening our current festival. I had the sad, elegant little shot glass blank sitting there. I looked at it, looked at the earrings, looked back at the shot glass, then said to myself, "Why not?" That is a question that I live by and one that has changed my life more often than not. I wrapped a pair of the callas around the glass, and while it was still pathetically small, it was also still elegant, which I believe bodes well for the future.

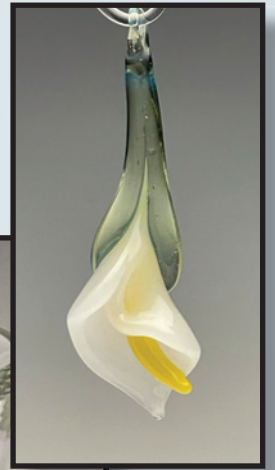
Another example of chimerism would be the *Pikafix*. I used to have people ask me for a cross pendant back when I did little special orders like that, and I developed a nice latticino cane to make even a small cross aesthetically interesting. My son was very into Pikachu at the time, and I had an extra cross lying on the work area. Uh-oh, you're thinking, and you would be right. Thus came about the first *Pikafix*. I made the first one for my son, but somebody saw him wearing it and asked for another. I like it, since it lets me push peoples' buttons a little. Some religious people, of which I am one, have no sense of humor, and it's fun to push them a little to see which way they jump.

New Life for Elements from the Past

Several years ago, I went all out and made an orchid with either five or eight full blossoms along the branch of the plant. I took the time to make it right, but it just sat there for a few years and I got tired of dusting it. I took it apart and have used four of the blossoms to create nice little medium scale pieces, all of which have sold quickly. I used the leaves from the bottom of the stem with an iris and added a couple of dichroic butterflies that had been in a drawer somewhere for a few years. Not a bad piece at all.

Many years ago, maybe a dozen or more, I did a near life-size stargazer lily with a straight stem to stand in a vase. Nothing happened with it, and it ended up in a bin for 10 years. When I pulled it out, the vase was long gone, and I could see that the stem was a problem. I twirled it around to create a stand in which the blossom could be centered. Again, I had extra butterfly wings, so I built three of them and joined them together as if in a feeding frenzy over the flower.

Back in the day, I had also done a series of scent bottles in pink and red, as though to attract hummingbirds. I rescued some of the little birds from becoming earrings and used them to embellish the outside of the bottle.

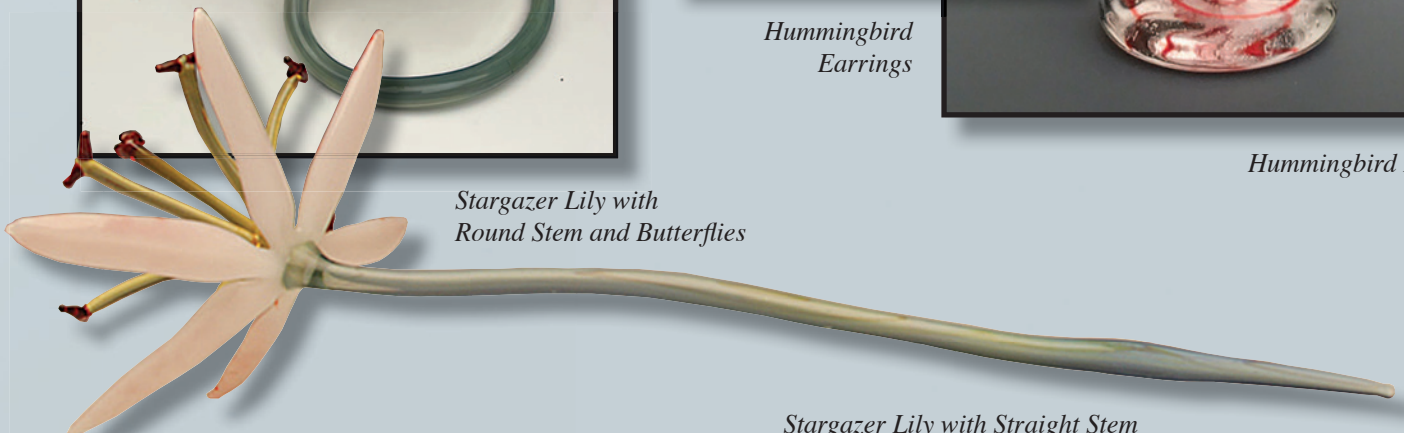

The Value of Objective Decisions

You may notice that a common denominator in all these cannibalized works is that a number of years had passed before being reconfigured for a new purpose. One reason is that since they did not sell, I still had them to mess around with. Since they did not sell, they also occupied a less and less favorable position in my estimation of them. I find that with the separation of time, the personal, emotional connection is lessened, which makes it much easier to make objective decisions about a piece.

When I have just finished something, it is sometimes difficult to evaluate it dispassionately. I may have mentioned that I am married—thirty-nine years as of this writing—and I owe a debt of gratitude to my wife for her willingness to be honest with her perspective on my work. It is not always a pleasant experience, but it is always helpful if I am able to receive it with an open heart and mind.

Finding New Homes for Previous Designs

I had prepared a large number of butterfly fish for various projects and have them here and there, waiting to be implemented in a design. They serve well as aquatic background elements, and I have used them in many, many pieces. Here you can see how well they fill out the environment of the lionfish sculpture.

In the throes of absolutely bonkers busyness, one season I made quite a few little owls on branches. They were not bad, but not really that interesting either. I was on the verge of throwing them out, little stands and branches and all, when I thought that I should try to do something with them. Once you consider the idea of trashing them, you've got to realize that you're free to do anything you want with them. I added wings, lengthened the horizontally protruding branch, and gave them either one or two or three little owllet babies next to them. They turned out to be very nice and have been moving quite well.

I post a little one-minute time lapse video every Thursday on Facebook and Instagram. One week I did a human hand that was kind of elegant, but it seemed to need something more—something to tell a story. I had a tiny little butterfly with highly detailed patterns on its wings that gave the hand just the right touch to make it more than just a hand.

Taking Advantage of Second Chances

Ten years ago, I took the time to do a very nice little deer and mounted it on a really stupid looking tree that was not even nearly as nice as the deer. Since I had invested actual time and effort into the stupid tree, though, it kicked around for a long time. Did I say that it can be hard to be objective when you have invested time and effort into a project? But time keeps on slippin', slippin' into the future, and before you know it, you are no longer attached to the piece and can just make an executive decision.

The tree had to go, but I kept the little deer and used it to illustrate another video I made demonstrating a black panther. Of course, they do not typically live in the same regions, but I think it works on a subconscious predator versus prey level. I am happy to have found something to do with the nice little deer.

Most of the examples listed here lean more toward the cannibalism than chimera category, but you get the idea. What is most important is to be willing to try. Take it apart, put it back together differently, and see what you get!

The Story of Glass and Wine

On July 3, 2021, The Corning Museum of Glass (CMoG), located within New York State's Finger Lakes Wine Country, opened *Fire and Vine: The Story of Glass and Wine*, a special exhibit exploring the deeply entwined relationship between wine and glass. Presenting the art, history, and science of how glass touches wine as it travels from the grape and the bottle, then to the cup on our tables, the exhibit is largely drawn from the Museum's own holdings, the world's most comprehensive collection of glass. *Fire and Vine* will also demonstrate how the combination of wine and glass has figured into social gatherings for thousands of years, from the lavish feasts of Ancient Rome and the polite society of 1700s Britain to the essential experience within our food culture today. The exhibit is organized by Katherine Larson, curator of Ancient Glass at CMoG.

Glass Implements and Their Importance to Society

As Katherine Larson explained: "It is easy to forget that the empty glass cups, pitchers, ewers, and bottles in museum display cases once held lush and luxuriant wine. For *Fire and Vine*, we have brought together objects that tell the story of how, for more than 2,500 years, the strength, impermeability, and versatility of glass have played an important role in every step of a wine's journey and factor into the production, distribution, sale, and ultimately the enjoyment of this intoxicating beverage."

Fire and Vine will feature a display of dozens of wine glasses from around the world that represent the many styles, tastes, and occasions where wine was part of the festivities. Highlights of the exhibit also include a rare 2,000-year-old fragment of cameo glass depicting a grape harvest and a still-sealed bottle of wine found in an 18th-century shipwreck off the coast of England. A 17th-century Italian document describing an "almost unbreakable glass jar" that could prevent wine from spoiling and a set of antique French hydrometers for measuring the alcohol content of wine, among other fascinating objects, most of which have seldom been on display, have been pulled from the Museum's permanent collection, as well as from the collection of the Museum's Rakow Research Library.

A Mutual Home for Wine and Glass

The story of glass and wine has particular relevance in the Finger Lakes of New York State, the home of U.S. Bonded Winery No. 1, established in 1860. There, cold-climate European vinifera grape varieties like Riesling were first introduced in eastern North America in the mid twentieth century. Concurrent with the growth of Finger Lakes wines, Corning, New York, emerged as the "Crystal City," widely recognized as a world leader for its accomplishments in glass artistry and innovation.

Independent, entrepreneurial wine-makers and glass artists have found a mutual home in this region, building on historical traditions with new creative energy that makes Corning and the Finger Lakes Wine Country a hub for the entwined industries. Recognizing this important shared history, the exhibit will also include objects on loan from the Dr. Konstantin Frank Winery and Pleasant Valley Wine Company, the oldest winery in the Finger Lakes Region, including sealed bottles of historic vintages from these notable wineries. The Glenn H. Curtiss Museum will also contribute to the exhibit.

“Two of the most powerful stories in Finger Lakes Wine Country’s history center around wine and glass. The story that’s not often told is how imperative glass is to wine, so the *Fire and*

Vine exhibit is exciting in that regard,” said Laury Ward, President of Finger Lakes Wine Country. “Finger Lakes wines continue to receive global recognition for their high quality and cool climate varietals. There is no denying that our winemaking legacy would be incomplete without our history in glassmaking to complement it.”

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Pilchuck Glass School Fifty Years Young

Pilchuck, the glass school on the hill, nestled in the lush forests north of Seattle, Washington, was born in 1971 when 18 brave students joined Dale Chihuly, Ruth Tamura, and a few other teachers for an eight-week program of study. Born from the countercultural spirit of the day, the founders envisioned a “lived” curriculum that combined wilderness survival with concentrated material investigation and experimentation.

Early participants carved out a rudimentary hot shop, and personal dwellings ranged from tents and cars to stumps. Sprouting from these primitive roots, the school has transformed over the last 50 years from a transient experiment to a leading center for research into the creative applications of glass and an essential node in an international network of educational exchange.

Exploring New Paths in a Post-Pandemic World

There is much to be celebrated looking back at the school’s eventful and impactful history, but as we approach this important 50th anniversary milestone, we have our gaze firmly fixed on the future of the organization. The initial tenets of experimentation, material curiosity, international engagement, and a grounding in the natural environment will continue to be at the core of the school’s educational mission. Moving forward, we will work to remove barriers to participation and make sure that the Pilchuck experience is accessible and engaging to artists from a wide spectrum of life experiences.

Obviously navigating the tail end of a global pandemic is not how any organization would choose to celebrate such an important birthday. After having canceled all of last year’s on-site programming, we came to a difficult conclusion this spring that we still could not guarantee a safe learning environment to run our large-scale educational program that brings students, teachers, and artists from all over the world to our small community here in Washington. Having curated a particularly rich lineup of talent for our 50th anniversary program, we decided to postpone those classes until the summer of 2022 and create a whole new approach to Pilchuck programming for this summer.

Small Group Open-Air Residency Series

Presented with a rare blank slate and determined to deliver on our mission during this important year, we got to work on designing a new program that we internally referred to as “the golden pivot.” We decided to mark the original summer season with a series of Open-Air Residencies. By inviting small groups of largely local artists to campus for thematic residencies, we plan to minimize health risks to our participants and community while still creating the charged atmosphere of fearless studio innovation and an open source platform of technical, aesthetic, and conceptual inquiry that defines Pilchuck.

Running from June until the end of August, the residencies will each feature artists, teachers, and themes central to next year's workshop program. The first session will feature Indigenous glass artists from the region and examine how we can best create opportunities and provide access to the material for artists from native communities both locally and around the world. The following residency will feature parent artists and their families as a pilot program to test how we can make Pilchuck's opportunities more supportive of this often overlooked demographic. "The Innovators," a group of residents at various stages of their careers whose studio practices have led to technical or artistic breakthroughs in their respective fields, will wrap up the eight weeks of the original program.

Providing Opportunities for Area Artists

In partnership with Crafting the Future, we are excited to host a group of recent alumni and hardworking staff from Hilltop Artists, a program providing access to glass and crucial services to youth throughout the Tacoma, Washington, public school system. These talented young artists will have a supported opportunity to develop their own artwork under the guidance of artistic advisors Cedric Mitchell and Corey Pemberton from Crafting the Future. Pilchuck, along with our fellow craft schools, is well positioned to provide bridges that help young artists navigate the professional gaps from supported student or youth participants to fully independent artists. We have created a paid work/study fellowship program this summer during which participants will balance their support of the campus, studios, and residents with their own professional and creative development.

For the first time this year, we will host a think tank residency examining how our campus and programs can better support students with a diversity of physical and neural abilities. We will also host our first Innovation in Imagery residency to push new approaches in combining analog and digital print techniques and glass. In addition to all our new residencies, our annual cohorts of Hauberg fellows and emerging artists in residence will all share time and space on campus this summer and into the fall. While we have sadly shrunk the number of participants in this year's programs, we are confident that each artist involved will have a transformative experience.

Navigating Pilchuck's Future

The official celebration of our 50th year will now kick off with this year's auction in October and run through next fall's homecoming on campus and auction events. Along the way there will be all sorts of digital and in-person events, artist opportunities, and exhibitions to celebrate the achievements of the school and the artists who have shaped its path. The 2022 workshop program is perhaps the most diverse in the school's history in terms of ideas, techniques, and representation. It is designed to both draw new artists into the conversation around glass and engage those who are already fluent and in search of new vocabulary.

Despite the challenges of the day, Pilchuck will reemerge from the pandemic a more holistically healthy organization. With a renewed focus on accessibility and inclusion, we will thoughtfully work to dismantle and overcome physical, economic, and cultural barriers to participation throughout our mountainside campus and portfolio of programs and opportunities. We are exploring how we can best support and extend the vital work of youth programs and public access studios locally and around the country through which we are doing the critical work to ensure that we hear a more richly diverse chorus of voices in our field moving forward.

I know I speak for all the organizations when I say that we cannot wait for the day when we hear the many languages and laughs of our students, artists, and teachers reanimating our school on the hill.

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Overcoming Creative Blocks

Creative people are often plagued with self-doubt, but there are few things as frightening and humbling as feeling blocked. What do you do when your creative juices seem to have dried up? How do you cope with the insecurity and fear that you may never feel inspired again? If you are an artist, you may not have struggled with these feelings yet, but it is likely that someday you will. Then, what will you do?

We turned to four established glass artists to learn from their experiences. Their practical responses and a few samples of their impressive artwork are shared here to inspire you and to reassure you that creative blocks, while common, are generally transitory.

Linda Ethier

Kiln Formed Cast Glass and Pâte de Verre
50+ years

I'm filled with doubt whenever I start a new piece. It's like stage fright, but for artists. To mitigate this feeling, it helps to view each piece as an experiment that may or may not work out. If I don't like the piece or if it has technical difficulties, I take what lessons I can learn from it. After that, I find it quite liberating to throw the offending object into the trash.

When I find myself really stuck for inspiration, I try several techniques, most of which involve stepping away from the problem. I may clean and organize the studio or take up an activity or skill that is difficult and new to me. Doing something that requires prolonged intense focus usually works like a charm. Other techniques that have helped are having a studio play day, sometimes with friends, and studying the work of other artists to identify what about their work resonates with me. Finally, I go back into the studio and draw or build lots of small clay or wax models until I get something that inspires me.

Anne Nye

Kiln Formed Glass

20+ years

Finding ideas has never been an issue for me. At times they have even come to me full blown in a dream. My work is mostly nature inspired, so it's been helpful that I've traveled and lived in a lot of places with varied scenery.

Much of my work has a story behind it. Sometimes the story starts with the scene, but often, it's a combination of the visual and mental that finally gels in my head. For example, one of my pieces entitled *Crossing Over* was inspired by an outing I took in Tennessee while teaching at Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts.

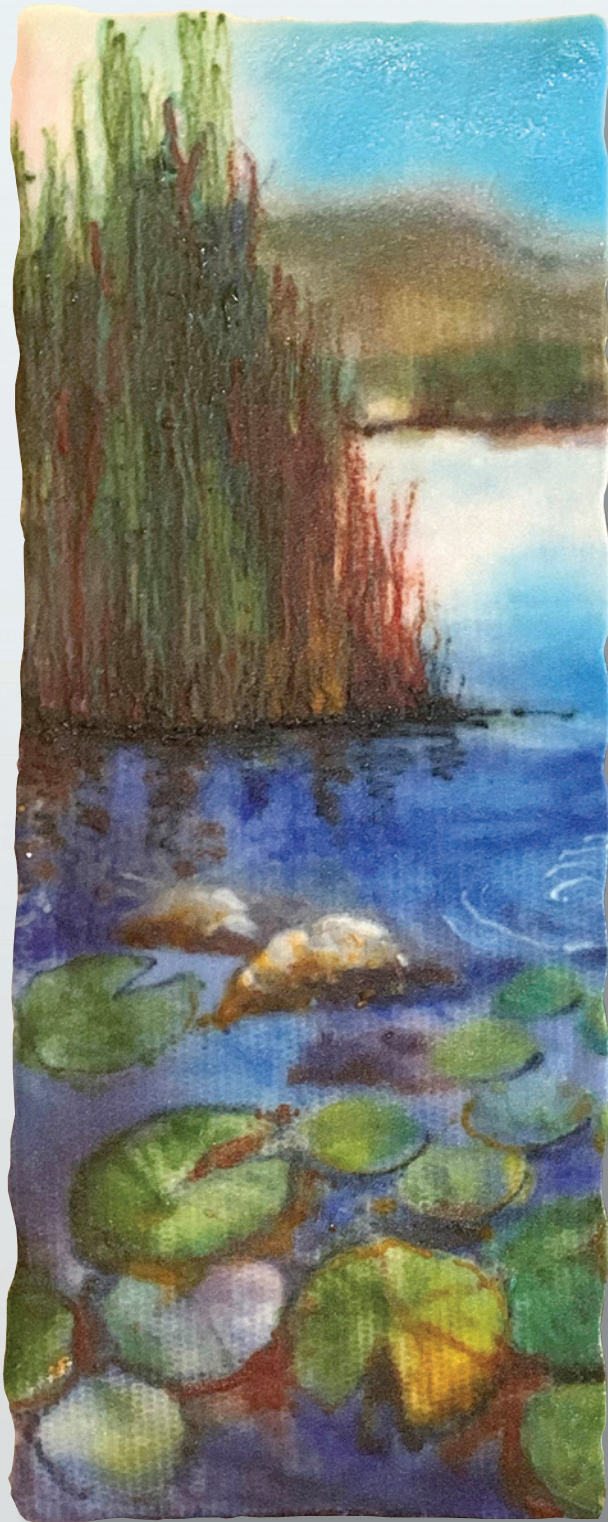
The mostly torn-down site was a retirement settlement built in the 1930s. I was struck by one area that had nothing left but the foundation stones. As I worked, the piece evolved from the original foundation stones to including rocks like those one might use to cross over a river. The far side was covered in mist, which made it difficult to know where to step.

The resulting image reflected my personal saga in which I had undergone a complete restructuring of my life. We often have plans that get interrupted by life and the way is no longer clear. As I age, using my art to tell stories has become more important to me than the actual scenes.

Etching, Carving, and Stained Glass
41 years

Am I filled with doubt? No! *Never!!* At times I may have felt waves of doubt, especially when I'm taking on a new process. That is something I do to myself by constantly challenging myself to explore and discover new ways and methods to create in glass. However, being "filled with doubt" would be crippling!

Am I blocked? No! Hopefully *Never!!* I sometimes feel a sense of anxiety when I'm trying to get my ideas and visions out of my head and onto paper. I may also experience a bit of anxiety on how I am going to interpret my ideas into glass using color and light. Throughout those uncomfortable moments, I have to have the confidence that I will succeed—that I will figure it out.

Depending upon the mode in which I am creating—etched and carved or stained and leaded art glass in color—my feelings of anxiety come upon me in different ways. When I begin to feel the unease of a looming block, I settle myself down and just begin to draw by putting pencil to paper. Sometimes I settle myself down by listening to just the right music—smooth jazz or classical for me. If a design still doesn't come, I look to my research for that final "push" to create a representation of the idea in my head. For example, if I'm doing an underwater-inspired piece, I look to photos of the underwater world to help spark and create my narrative, or even better, I go scuba diving!

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Amber Cowan

Flameworking and Glassblowing
20 years

Sometimes I get a block. When that happens, I usually say I am in a slump. A few things have helped me through that over the years, however, including taking a little time off. Normally, I am always working and tend to just go, go, go.

Taking a break for a little while can help. Travel also helps me and inspires some of my work. Going to the library and just looking through art or design books can also be a quick boost. I've also found that regular exercise energizes my body as well as my brain.

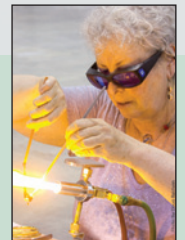

Capturing Memories through
Multimedia Collage Art

Glass is such a diverse and versatile medium for artistic expression. Many artists have personalized the medium to reflect truly original signature work. The next up-and-coming artist to grace the world stage of glass is contemporary mixed-media artist Oxana Kovalchuk, who has been working as an artist her entire life but is relatively new to the medium of glass. Kazakhstan was the last of the Soviet republics to declare independence during the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991, and in 1979 Oxana was born there, which means her mother tongue and cultural heritage is Russian.

Childhood Influences

Oxana's young experiences of being behind the Iron Curtain had an influence on her later endeavors. "When you are a child there is no assessment of what events are happening around you. Only family and the people near you are important. It was a little later in my early years that the awareness of closed borders and various other restrictions appeared. When I got the opportunity to travel and compare, I realized how rich the Russian culture and language are. I have a strong attachment to Mother Russia."

Oxana made a promise to herself that she would experience the variety of the wider world, and during her 42 years she has done just that. She has lived in numerous places including Omsk and Moscow in Russia, and Oxford in the United Kingdom. For the last six years she has resided in Edgewater, New Jersey, with her husband and three small children.

The artist's romance with art started at the age of four when she received a set of gouache paints for Christmas, and not long after she was enrolled in the Soviet Art Studio for Children. Soviet art school meant crafting dolls of salted dough, painting wallpaper, and using modeling clay to create elephants and giraffes. In her applied arts school, Oxana never copied other artwork, since she always wanted to add her own signature style. One of her paintings took first prize in the German Democratic Republic (GDR) contest and was featured in an arts magazine, which was her first but nowhere near her last media coverage.

In middle school Kovalchuk won a competition beating several applicants to study academic fine arts at the Fine Arts School in her home town of Pavlodar. She graduated with a red diploma, which is a distinction of excellence. In high school she was involved in special projects organized by her teacher, a former ballet dancer. Oxana was designing theatrical decorations as well as creating costumes and makeup styles for stage performers. That influenced her greatly, and the theme of performance is still reflected in her art projects today.

Pursuing a Passion for Professional Art

During her travels, Oxana immersed herself in cultural history, and she traveled extensively around the UK and Europe attending art show after art show. She also frequented prominent museums in the European art capitals—Amsterdam, Florence, Rome, Madrid, London, Paris. “It was a very enriching time for me, since I was meeting with numerous artists and creators while studying innovative new European art trends.”



After moving to New York City with her husband and two children at the time, the artist was impressed with New York, but she somehow felt torn. “The energy and pulse of NYC triggered my creative soul, challenging me to answer new questions. However, I was raising children in a new country. I technically turned into a housewife.

“I’ve always seen myself more as an independent female creator, and I was never obsessed with family life. To diversify this new routine, I found ways to create. Turning to the arts, I drew sketches while waiting for the kids in the swimming pool and created collages using groceries—fruits and vegetables, and even *khinkali*, a Georgian ravioli—while cooking for the family.”

Oxana realized quickly that she must pursue her passion as a professional artist. She immersed herself in New York culture by enrolling in the MFA program at the School of Visual Arts (SVA). She was assigned a studio in the Manhattan campus, a space that turned out to be her creative hideaway. “It was definitely a time of reexploring and reconsidering myself as an artist, as a New Yorker, as an immigrant, and as a mother. These angles of my personality were all overlapping.”

Kovalchuk graduated from the SVA in 2019 with her thesis works, which consisted of a series of glass collages entitled *The Illusion of Reality*. This series of works was devoted to the way our memories grasp and remember our experiences. “As we move around the globe, as we grow and evolve and our surroundings transform, m-e-m-o-r-y is the main platform we can rely on, and it triggers us. The ways our memory works and creates reality is a topic I’ve been exploring in my art pieces for some time.”

As I questioned Oxana further on the specificities of how she creates her collages, her eyes lit up and I could see the fire for the process in her belly. “My multimedia collages are made up of several layers of plate glass. Sometimes they can reach up to 25 sheets of glass! My artworks begin with an image that could be a photo I took for a project or a photo of my mixed-media collages. I use a UV flatbed printer to imprint my base image onto the first sheet of glass, and thereafter I build up my picture layer by layer. Collage is the strong driving force in my work, and these multiple strata paintings consist of drawings, paintings, and printed transparencies that are cut out and fixed by the next pane of glass. Over time, these two-dimensional images become in-depth images and transform into a three-dimensional memory.” Upon completion, her works are framed in light boxes.

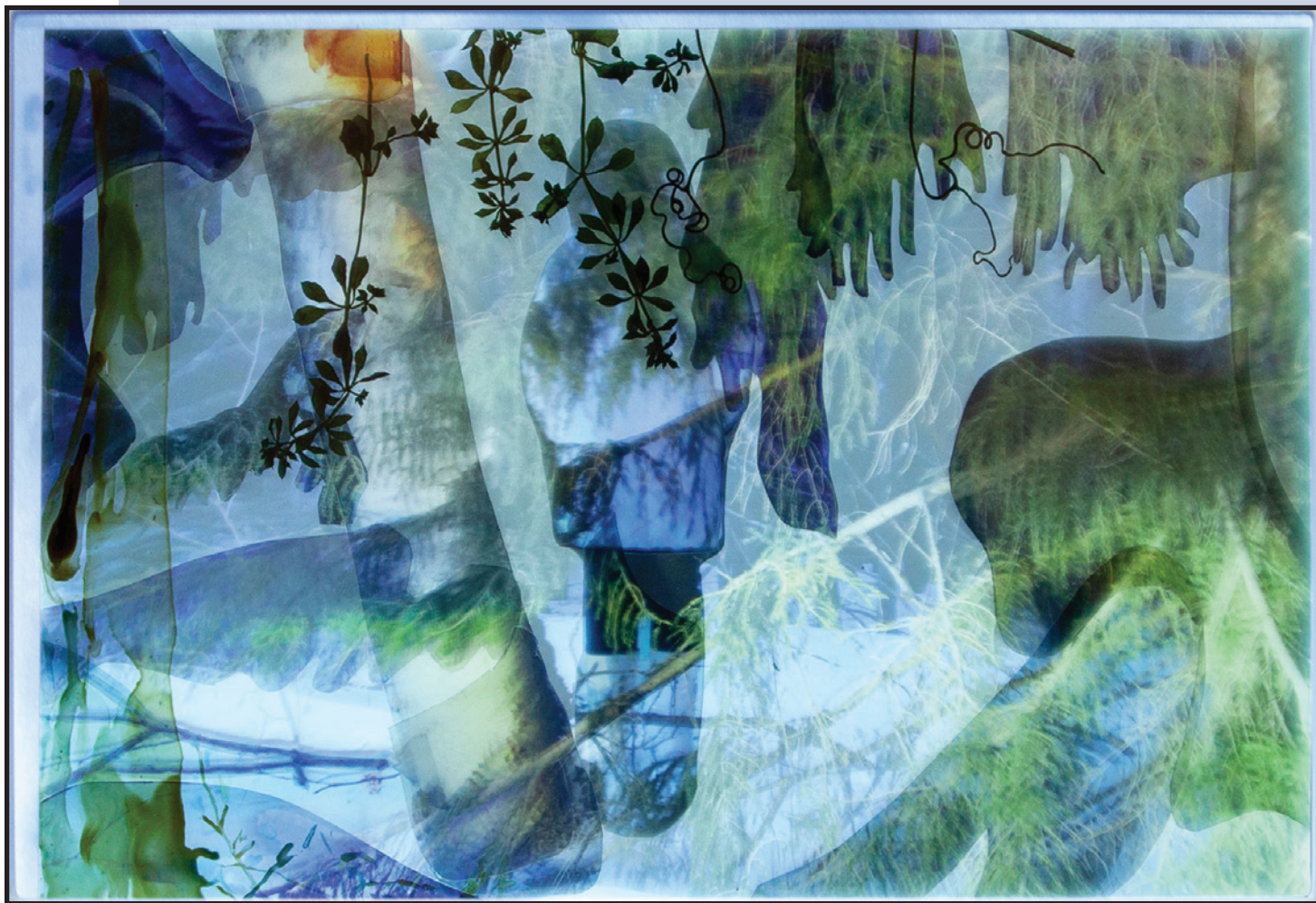
The Lure of Working in Glass

When speaking about her work, I asked Oxana what in particular has drawn her to glass and how she intends to progress. She finds that glass gives her opportunities that aren’t available in other artistic mediums.

“When I made *The Illusion of Reality* project about my immigrant experience, about memory, the idea was to show the layering and multiplicity of images at the same time. I needed to find the right material that met my idea and decided to use glass, which allowed me to make every element of my layered thoughts visible.

“I really love glass as a material. It always fascinates me. I look at it and it is hard, but at the same time it is very fragile. A couple of years ago I took several lessons in glass casting at UrbanGlass in Brooklyn, New York. There I experimented with sandcasting. It is great to work in this material when it is molten. I have ideas that I would like to implement, and I was planning to come back and work on this technique. Covid, of course, made some editing of everyone’s plans, but the ideas that came to me remained. This is one of my plans for the future.”

Oxana Kovalchuk is primarily obsessed with thoughts, but in glass, she has found the method to give her concepts their voice. "My work usually starts with an idea. I describe these ideas in detail. This is a thought process when I brainstorm and contemplate on a particular topic. During this period of the creative process, I think and read a lot. I find this very interesting. Usually, by the time I start a new artwork, project, or series, I already have my statement ready. The very process of creating works is very exciting as I immerse myself in it. Sometimes the work is very easy, and my projects are completed very quickly. Sometimes it is difficult to find the desired image, and then I suffer a lot! I love to experiment with ideas, materials, and different techniques."

Current Artistic Visions

When asked what she is working on right now, Oxana showed me some of her most recent collages from a series called *Place Yourself*. She referred me back to her collage technique, defining the deeper meaning in relation to her current obsession. These new works were made during the lockdown period of the Covid pandemic.

"The world is changing, and everyone is a part of this shift. Though many of these changes are inevitable, the pandemic has accelerated certain cycles and highlighted places of improvement. Now there is a global restructuring. New habits, rituals, and rules emerge. Absolutely everyone finds himself or herself in this new reality, where they must adapt. Humanity has accumulated a lot of new knowledge and experiences at a rapid pace. The question is how we connect these new skills with the old ways."

"I imagine this process, like the making of a patchwork quilt, is the same way that I create my collages. The best quilts use materials that are both old and new, with different textures and colors, to create something unique and beautiful. I envision us utilizing newfound skills to patch together the new world with the old one. People combine old and new knowledge to find solutions. Sometimes this works and there is a connection, but sometimes it does not fit. Our current reality is somewhat disjointed. Some pieces fit comfortably, and others do not. It is obvious when the old and new ways do not mesh."

Looking to the Future

Oxana shared what she wishes to achieve with her new series of works. "My recent collages reflect the blending of old and new, combining things that fit perfectly with things that don't quite have a place. When I layer the images and glass, I emphasize the visual process and suggest that it remains incomplete. I highlight the imperfections that still exist. The beauty, colors, and brightness give a sense of how beautiful the new reality will be, although we cannot see it all at once."

It is clear that Oxana is a realist who looks at the world with optimistic eyes. Currently she works out of a studio at the Neumann Leather Factory in Hoboken, New Jersey. She has also co-founded an arts organization called StartaArta, a movement that supports artists in New York City. This organization fosters an environment of trust where artists can share their art, gain exposure, and make connections to new communities and industries. Oxana organizes exhibitions, panel discussions, and projects to support artists. StartaArta's exhibition space is located within the Starta Accelerator in the heart of the Flatiron bustling business district, a crossover that provides a forum for collaboration where art meets the corporate world.

In the positive words of a contemporary artist in glass, "Life has changed, and new opportunities have appeared. People have started thinking and acting more collectively, supporting each other by sharing hope and faith. I believe this is what humanity is striving for now—to find the right balance and harmony. This is what unites us as a people. Our new reality will be layered scenes of interaction, love, and coming together. Everyday scenes speak loudly." **GA**

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Dr. Julie Anne Denton received her doctorate in the combination of sandcast and flameworked glass for artists from the National Glass Centre, UK. She has learned from and worked with the best flameworking artists in the world including Emilio Santini, Lucio Bubacco, Vittorio Costantini, Gianni Toso, Shane Fero, Loren Stump, and Sally Prasch, to name just a few. She rounded off her education with Bertil Vallien of the renowned Swedish design house Kosta Boda (est. 1742).

Julie settled in Zürich, Switzerland, in 2010. From the center of the city she runs her design firm, www.Atelier315.ch, and www.ZurichGlassSchool.com, her online learning platform for sculptural flameworking skills. She works with a small team beside her who all care deeply about quality education, creativity, and business.

Dr. Julie creates glass and bronze work that resonates beauty, workmanship, and authenticity. Her key themes are people, folklore, nature, and counterculture. She has also received worldwide recognition for her storytelling skills as an artist and her technical skills as a glassmaker.

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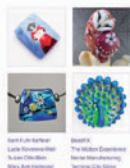
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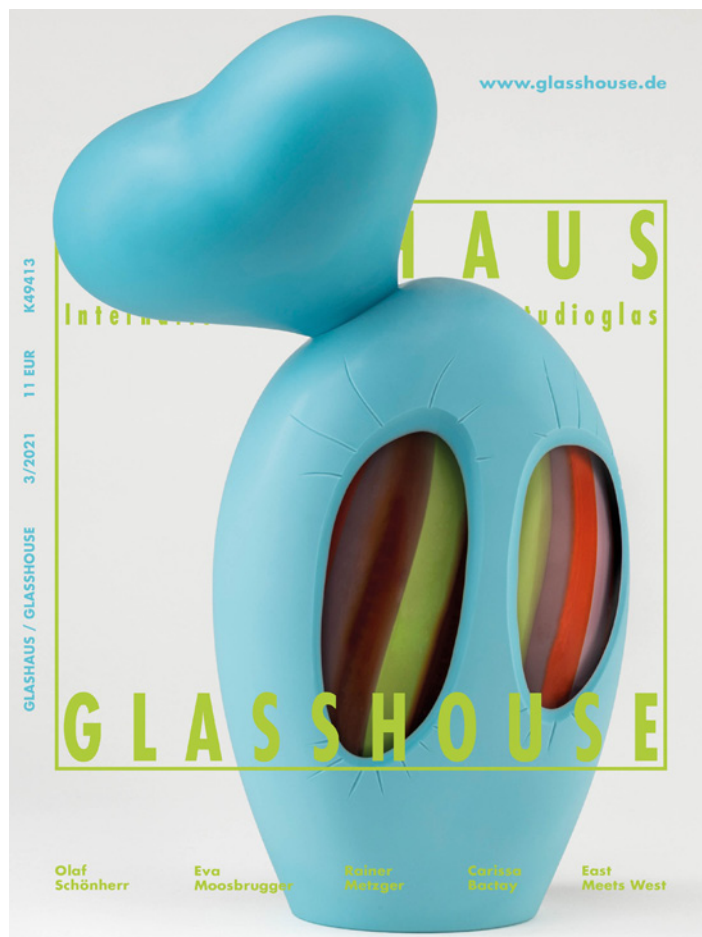
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CGS at the Pyramid Gallery

The Contemporary Glass Society (CGS) will be presenting a selected exhibition of glass by 33 of its members of the Contemporary Glass Society at Pyramid Gallery in York, England. *Life Forms*, which opens at 11 a.m. on September 11 and runs through October 30, 2021, will feature glass inspired by structure, form, and evolution in the natural world. This show, which had been set for 2020, was unfortunately postponed by Covid, but now exhibitors and attendees can truly celebrate these wonderful life forms.

CGS is the United Kingdom's foremost organization for supporting established artists as well as up-and-coming makers and for promoting contemporary glass in the wider art world. The organization invited its 950 UK and international members to submit for entry to their fifth exhibition at Pyramid Gallery in York, UK. From a submission of 84, the selection panel offered the exhibition to 33 glass artists including: Carolyn Basing, Mim Brigham, Isobel Brunson, Tabitha Burrill, Helen Eastham, Dominic Fonde, Jianyong Guo, Dot Hill, Catherine Hough, Katherine Huskie, Max Jacquard, Naomi Jacques, Susan Kinley, Yuki Kokai, Rebecca Laister, Monette Larsen, Nicky Lawrence, Jon Lewis, Roberta Mason, Anthony McCabe, Wendy Newhofer, Tracy Nicholls, Yoshiko Okada, Rebecca Rowland-Chandler, Helen Slater-Stokes, Nancy Sutcliffe, Angela Thwaites, Noreen Todd, Elizabeth Welch, Frans Wesselman, Sue Woolhouse, Sandra Young, and Maria Zuleuta.

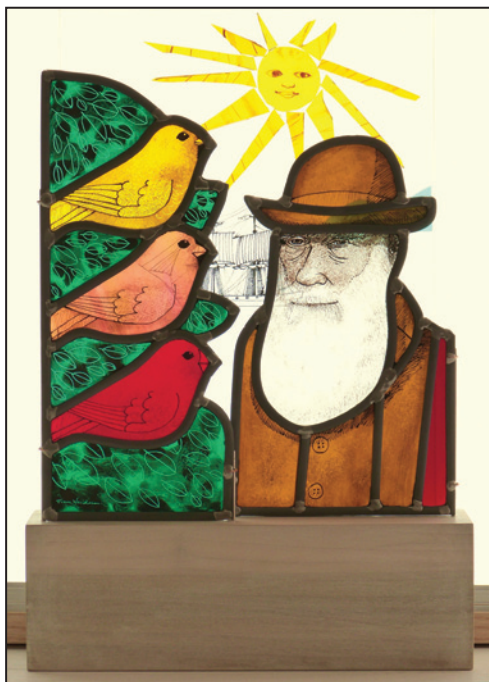

Celebrating Nature in Glass

With the broad ranging title *Life Forms*, this show includes a great variety of interpretations of the theme in forms that include fused wall pieces, cast forms, pâte de verre sculpture and wall pieces, blown and cold worked vessels and forms, and waterjet cut glass. Also included are painted and leaded glass, fused glass bowls, engraved bowls, lampworked glass, and mixed-media sculpture.

With the many recent protests about climate change and extinction of species, the organizers wanted to celebrate nature and natural forms while marking the 200th anniversary of the launch of the ship that would take Charles Darwin on his two-year voyage to the Galapagos Islands. *The Beagle* was launched on May 11, 1820, and Darwin eventually published his seminal work, *On the Origin of Species* in 1859.

Pyramid Gallery has a long-standing reputation for showing and representing contemporary glass artists in York that goes back to 1982 and has been working with the CGS since 2008. Gallery owner and manager Terry Brett was part of the selection panel along with glass artist Effie Burns and CGS Administrator Pam Reekie. "We have selected a variety of styles that represent different techniques, but with a view to how the whole show will look," says Terry "It is important to me that we include work by both high-profile glass artists and those who are closer to the beginning of their careers. The standard is very high, as is the imagination of the artists in interpreting the theme."

York is a center of excellence for stained glass, so it is very appropriate that one of the center pieces of this show is a painted and leaded glass portrait of Charles Darwin by Frans Wesselman. This beautifully made study includes three varieties of finches that gave Darwin the necessary data to help him formulate his evolutionary theory.

In contrast to the Darwin portrait, the plight of coral reefs is alluded to in the work by Roberta Mason. She will be showing three vessels inspired by the marine animals known by their scientific name, *Porifera*, or more commonly, sponges. These creatures are recognized as the least evolved creatures in the animal kingdom, but they are also extremely numerous with about 5,000 different species.

Visual Lessons

The exhibition promises to bring something of a visual lesson in natural science as well as a treat for collectors of glass. It will open with a public event that will be attended by some of the artists. The exhibition is then open every day from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. except for Sundays.

Close to the Minster and situated on Stonegate, one of York's busiest streets, the gallery is housed in a 600-year-old building that is owned by the National Trust. The building is distinctive but small, with an overhanging first floor that is typical of mediaeval buildings in York. Because of its small Victorian window, the building is easy to miss, but in the upstairs gallery, a great deal of glass will be on display in a charming setting.

United Nations Approves 2022 as the International Year of Glass

On May 18, 2021, the formal resolution was agreed on at the United Nations General Assembly declaring the year 2022 as the International Year of Glass. AGG has supported and endorsed this initiative from the onset, joining the chorus of 1,500 universities and research centers, societies, associations, museums, artists, educators, manufacturers, and companies in 79 countries on 5 continents.

The International Commission on Glass (ICG), the Community of Glass Associations (CGA) and ICOM-Glass are promoting 2022 as a United Nations International Year of Glass to underline its scientific, economic, and cultural roles. Glass supports many

vital technologies, facilitates sustainability and a green world, and enriches our lives through glass art.

The vision of a United Nations International Year of Glass (IYoG2022) is to celebrate the past, present, and future of this transformative material. "Glass artists across the globe have given humankind an awareness of this wonderful material, including its remarkable methods of fabrication, inherent beauty, and ability to capture and display nature's full spectrum of color."

Hundreds of activities in museums and exhibitions, academia and research, education and dissemination, plus companies and societies are planned across the planet. They will be focused on a universal distribution of activities at all educational levels. The Internet, underpinned by glass fiber cables and viewed through glass screens, will support communication. The IYoG2022 is designing a framework to record, develop, and share ideas across the glass world based on its website, www.iyog2022.org, and a LinkedIn group titled International Year of Glass 2022.
